
This Aeroflow Performance kick-down cable kit is designed to suit TH400 electric gearboxes only. This cable is made from stainless steel braided covering over a hard-wearing high-quality PTFE liner, which are made with an extruded liner for extended life. These also feature aluminium fittings and ferrules to eliminate frayed ends. They contain all necessary hardware for a complete installation, although some modification may still be required depending on application.






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- Remove the cable end stop, kick-down throttle body fitting, and kick-down cable adjuster from the kick-down cable. Leave the kickdown mounting bracket on the kick-down cable adjuster.
- Remove the back cover from the aluminium switch box and remove the slide trigger and inner wire. 2.
- Mount the aluminium switch box. The aluminium switch box is designed to be mounted to the bottom of the transmission on the passenger side. Using the provided 5/16"-18 x 1-1/4" bolts with flat washers and spacers. The spacers go between the mounting bracket and the transmission pan.
- The kick-down mounting bracket mounts onto a carburettor bracket. This carburettor bracket is sold separately. Most of these brackets are aftermarket and may require modification to fit this kick down cable mounting bracket along with a throttle cable for your application. Attach the kick-down mounting bracket to the carburettor bracket using the supplied #8-32 x 1/2" button head bolt and nyloc nut through the small 3/16" diameter centre holes in both brackets, but do not tighten yet. Insert the throttle cable adjuster (with the rear nut still installed) from the rear through the top holes in both brackets. Position it so that the bracket is roughly centred in the threaded part of the cable adjuster. Install the front adjuster nut. Tighten the throttle cable adjuster nuts, the button head bolt and nut, and the kick-down cable adjuster nuts.



- 5. Route the cable housing up to the kick-down cable adjuster. Make sure that the inner wire is removed from the cable housing. Slide the ferrule down the housing towards the transmission, away from the end that is being cut.
  - NOTE: Do not remove the ferrule. Measure the distance between the kick-down cable adjuster and the kick-down cable transmission bracket. Add 1" to the measurement and cut the cable housing to that length. After cutting the cable housing, put the ferrule back in place at the end of the cable housing. And insert the cable housing and ferrule into the kick-down cable adjuster.
- 6. Separate the hex carb fitting from the kick-down throttle body fitting. Install the hex carb fitting onto the carburettor throttle arm.
- 7. Separate the aluminium switch box from the mounting bracket by removing the two 1/4"-28 x 3/8" button head bolts.
- **8.** Make sure the spring is still in place on the inner wire, and reinstall the inner wire into the kick-down cable housing. Position the slide trigger back into its slot in the aluminium switch box.
- 9. Feed the wires (Sold Separately) through the rubber grommet into the aluminium switch box, and install the two small wire terminals onto the ends of the wires. Connect both of the wires to the switch terminals. It does not matter which wire is connected to which terminal. Reinstall the aluminium switch box cover.
- **10.** Connect one of the wires from the aluminium switch box to a switched power source with a 5 amp or greater fuse. Install the remaining large wire terminal onto the end of the other wire, and connect it to the vertical terminal on the detent solenoid on the transmission.



- 11. Before connecting the inner wire to the carburettor, make sure that the throttle linkage is properly adjusted. Verify at the carburettor that the throttle is wide open while you have a helper hold the accelerator pedal to the floor. Once you are sure that the throttle linkage is adjusted correctly, slide the kick-down throttle body fitting onto the kick-down cable inner wire, and connect the kick-down throttle body fitting to the hex carb fitting.
- 12. This step will also be much easier with a helper. Slide the kick-down cable end stop onto the inner wire. Move the throttle to wide open and hold it there while pulling the kick-down inner wire as tight as possible. Slide the cable end stop up against the kick-down throttle body fitting and tighten the set screw using the supplied Allen key wrench. Release the throttle.
- 13. Minor adjustments can be made using the kick-down cable adjuster on the carburettor bracket. Double check to be sure that all carburettor, throttle and kick-down linkage operates freely without binding and that the throttle returns to the closed position when the pedal is released. Then, test drive. Once the kick-down cable is correctly adjusted and operating properly you can cut off the excess inner wire, leaving about 1/2" extending beyond the cable end stop to allow for future adjustment if needed.
